



## Ties To The Land Registration Information

If you own and care for forest land, you probably have strong feelings about leaving your land in good condition for the future. You know the trees you planted and nurtured are likely to outlive you. Not many people dedicate themselves to growing something with a longer life cycle than their own.

A big part of preserving the legacy is passing the land to your successors. Yet, effective transition is harder than most forest landowners realize. A smooth transfer takes not only passion, but preparation and planning beyond an estate plan.

Most landowners do not have a succession plan for the forest property they have worked so hard to develop and maintain. One reason for this: Passing property from one generation to the next is legally and emotionally challenging. This program is designed to give landowners the tools to make a successful transition.

Ties To The Land is a workshop that focuses on ways to maintain family ties to the land from generation to generation, building awareness of key challenges facing family forest ownership, and motivating families to address those challenges. This workshop is a mix of presentations and practical exercises to help families develop techniques needed to address these issues. Registrants will receive a copy of the Ties to the Land workbook and additional resources, which are designed to help families continue to improve their communications about the future of their woodlands.

This is a two-session class.
